The bed was moved out and replaced with a murphy bed last spring given that I needed to make room for a 24”, 51 year old Macomber 8-shaft which I purchased from the White River Craft Center.

The Macomber came with a sticky shed which responded well to a heavy cleaning of the shaft grooves along with silicon spray as recommended by Macomber. The loom has been up and running since early January and I'm on my third short warp. This loom, with its heavy steel harnesses and steel heddles is a very different weaving experience for me, but I am thrilled with the detail of the fabric I've produced so far. And now I can go back through all my issues of "Handwoven" to weave those 8-shaft drafts I have ignored.
